

Antipolitism: How it Works

The truth is that I didn't really invent or discover Antipolitism as, like natural law, it has always been there waiting in camouflage for someone of imagination to see it. All it took for me to uncover its truth was to be free of the ambition that had always consumed me and ultimately landed me in prison where my record made the resumption of career advancement impossible in conventional terms. Once I accepted that I wasn't going to be the boss anymore as I always had been in the past, free from the deadly sins—for to seek power is to suffer from all of them—my vision widened immensely. I won't go through the reasons that no decent person will ever run particularly for higher office yet again, because I'm sure you get it by now. Finally, as a last bastion of protection from a schmuck president, they set up the Electoral College. Two out of three of these protections are gone and the last barrier to complete chaos, the Electoral College, is under attack by, what a surprise, mostly Leftists. genocidal maniacs. I am simply referring to the politicians and bureaucrats who have a common self-interest in a growingly intrusive state. They collude unconsciously because their self-interests align.

Therefore, I believe the deep state, in all of its corruption, must be swept away and democracy achieved by a new and incorruptible system: Antipolitism. It is as close to perfect a system as could ever be possible. It is representative of all of our nation's demographics. It makes any sort of corruption nearly impossible. **It wipes out the power of ALL special interests and eliminates political parties forever.**

Before I lay out the plan, allow me to address what will be the ruling class's primary argument against: You will lose all of our experience in favor of amateurs who know nothing about governing. I answer with one sentence: *Yeah, and you have done such a wonderful job so far* (make sure as you read this you make it drip with sarcasm in your mind as that is my intended tone). The truth is, there is no rational argument against Antipolitism, only cynicism fueling acceptance of an already failed system. We need to divorce ourselves once and for all from our current system that is nothing more than a parasite masquerading as symbiotic. They need us, but we don't need them. They are mosquitoes, not remoras.

I understand that this all sounds too good to be true, so I will prove my case by getting down to the nuts and bolts. To begin, the new system will require amending the Constitution to erase all rules for elective positions while preserving the Bill of Rights. The number of congressional representatives and senators will remain unchanged as well. However, **the term of office for all federal offices, including the executive branch, will be four years. All officials shall be limited to a single term and, once having served, the ex-congresspeople, senators, presidents, and vice presidents can never be eligible to serve again in any federal office. It's one and done, period.**

Elections shall be abolished federally and replaced by a secure lottery system similar to how juries are chosen. All congressional districts shall be

redrawn to equal sized and geometrically simple near-rectangles in a number equal to a state's number of representatives. No gerrymandering shall be permitted nor necessary, as all political parties will be obsolete given that there are no elections and therefore no power to seek or protect. Eligible persons shall be chosen at random in each district and statewide depending upon the office as part of a pool of citizens produced from a census after the following screens are applied:

1. For a representative, a minimum of a Bachelor's Degree from a recognized college or university.
2. For a senator, a minimum of a Master's Degree or the equivalent graduate degree i.e. JD, MD, DO, etc.
3. The education requirement shall be waived for those men and women who have founded and run a business with 10 or more employees continually for 5 or more years for BOTH House and Senate. Entrepreneurs are tough, free thinkers and we need them regardless of formal education. The education requirement will also be waived for those persons, self-employed or not, that earn an annual income from a job or profession in the top third of all Americans on average. We want as broad a representation as possible in our new legislative and executive branches and don't want to close the door on the exceptional. There are a lot of brilliant auto-didacts for whom formal education was too slow that are better informed than most college graduates. Generally this reflects in their success and earnings.
4. A person must be actively working full-time. No inherited or passive income from trusts or any other source. No work, no serve. One cannot understand the costs of life's struggle without having to pay for them by one's own sweat.
5. The minimum age to be eligible is 35. I understand that this may rankle those younger, but the very fact it might points to an immaturity

of judgment. Our nation needs wisdom which can ONLY come from a broad and varied experience that only time can provide. In fact, with life spans increasing, Congress may have to revisit this from time to time. Note that retirees are ineligible but there is no upper age limit. Not working is a choice, but if a person chooses to stay engaged, we as a nation would be stupid to reject such experience. Personally, I plan to die with my boots on.

6. No convicted felons are eligible. Goodbye to me. Oh well.

The result of these filters will be a pool of seasoned, smart representatives with skin in the game EXACTLY as the founders intended but without the restrictions on gender and race. We exclude equally the idlers, the retirees who have opted for leisure, and the trust fund babies living off the success of others. I am not saying these are bad people, but I am saying that we shouldn't want them in charge. No work, no higher education, no business or professional achievement, no play. Period. Simple, straightforward, and yes, unabashedly elitist. **We want elites to govern so long as there are no barriers but laziness, failure or lack of ability to participate.** America's elite will be wide open to everyone who works to deserve it. The self-starters and autodidacts have and always will find their way, and in an antipolitical system absent almost all regulation, their paths will be a lot clearer to success. The door is closed to nobody but slackers.

Every citizen who meets the screening requirements will be assigned a number from zero to however many people are eligible in any particular district of each state for representatives to the House. For Senators, a second number will be assigned relative to the total population of the state and a drawing done for the two required. Numbers will be painted or printed on ping pong balls and placed into a lottery machine which will then spit out randomly the number of the person chosen. This simple and proven system cannot be hacked as it is not connected to the internet. Its stand-alone simplicity guarantees its integrity. No more fixed elections, real or imagined.

If a chosen person chooses not to accept their duty and serve, their absolute right, then another drawing will be done until the seat is filled.

My belief is that as Americans become comfortable with the new system, a culture of education and preparedness will be the result among those with the drive and work ethic to be potentially chosen. From K-College children will know that they TRULY one day could be a congressperson, senator, or president based upon their achievement, not money. I cannot imagine how this could not be a healthy outcome.

Further, **our Congress in both Houses, because of the random selection, will be much more female, much more interracial, much more gay or lesbian, and much less filled with attorneys.** With small variances caused only by the luck of the blind draw, our national legislature will mirror the best of America. This should be of no concern to anyone holding onto old prejudices as success breeds common values of wanting to retain the fruits of one's labors. The idea of small government and low taxes comes naturally to anyone who has earned their money the hard way.

Though we are a very diverse country, once one has done the hard work and paid the price for success, perceptions are surprisingly consistent and cultural differences disappear. People who work hard for success won't give it away or succumb to regulation and taxation easily regardless of race, gender, nationality, religion or various life choices/biological imperatives. We will find out that common sense is universal when achievement is present and that victimhood is the narcotic of failure and the tool of hustlers and liars, you know, most of our politicians and so-called leaders now.

Each new Congress will be drawn 6 months prior to taking over from the last in order to allow side by side, on the job training by each successor beside his or her predecessor. Each congressperson and senator shall be paid per diem exactly what they earned during the year previous to their selection.

For example, an MD who earned \$365,000 the year prior to joining Congress would receive \$1,000 per day for every day he or she attends Congress. Congress will no longer be a full-time job. Today the average congressperson spends 6-8 hours per day, yes you read that correctly, dialing for dollars mandatorily in secret call centers across the street from the capital set up by the political parties expressly for that purpose and to “shade” the laws that forbid fundraising in the Capitol building itself.¹ Antipolitism renders all of that moot. So a teacher earning, say, \$70,000 per year would receive \$191 per day and would still likely be able to keep teaching but for a few substitute days. What a wonderful teaching experience to pass along firsthand to students! The point is, no financial benefit nor harm shall be the result of being called upon to serve. Travel, lodging, meals, etc. will be paid by the government and all legislators will live in a government-owned apartment complex, very well protected, of course, to foster comity and esprit de corps. The space will be available in any one or more of a number of empty buildings that previously housed unnecessary, shut down departments like Education, Energy, or Commerce just to name a few of the many that will face extinction. Ours will be a citizen legislature of the accomplished, just as the founders intended. No limos. No private jets. Well, unless they already belong to the person selected. That would be perfectly fine. Just none paid for by us!

Gone will be the poll-takers and remora-like political hangers-on of today. Gone will be the mindless political talking points parroted by today’s turd fondlers. Staff will be chosen for their ability to assist their bosses’ analyses of pertinent information, not shield or manipulate for reelection. The level of political discourse will rise in direct proportion to the freedom of expression by legislators from diverse, educated backgrounds who have no politics to consider. A new, golden age will emerge. Imagine that, reason trumping polling. What a concept.

The president and vice president will be chosen much as a parliament chooses a Prime Minister from the Congress' own ranks two years into their terms. The new executives' terms of 4 years will overlap Congress by 2 years to provide smooth consistency of experience between the Executive and Legislative branches. After working together for 2 years, plenty of time will have elapsed for those serving in Congress to know who their best and brightest are. What a glorious spectacle of transparent, party-less democracy it will be when a president and vice president are chosen! It will be something akin to the Catholic cardinals choosing a pope but instead out in the open as opposed to cloistered in the Sistine Chapel. And if a mistake is made, well, impeachment provisions shall remain intact and it won't be a partisan witch-hunt, again, as there will be no political parties.

And gone will be the imperial trappings of power like playing "Hail to the Chief" and other royalist vestiges. American presidents will be addressed simply as Mr. or Ms. or whatever. Never "Mr. President". There will be no more inaugural galas either. In America, we honor and live the notion that we have no kings or queens either in name or practice. We fought the Revolution to abandon such things, not revert as we have done presently.

Now, all of this wonderful stuff still will have to happen in our modern world. Therefore, what is to stop the parasites of personal destruction from laying waste to the lives of those chosen to serve? What is to stop them from dredging up every past indiscretion and ruining the lives of people who did not ask for that kind of treatment?

I mean, is this not why today the truly decent and talented would rather have hot irons shoved up their asses than enter public life? Is this not the reason today all that we can expect are the demented, repressed, manipulative, or shamelessly megalomaniacal? Is this not a huge reason that we are stuck in a tyranny of the power-addicted? And beware the charming as charm is always a lie.

In Antipolitism, we cannot force anyone to serve. That would, in today's environment, be cruel and unusual punishment. Even absent parties, there will still be heated debate and a few pieces of shit will sneak through the screens and go low. Plus, outside special interests stripped of their power to legally bribe with campaign money may very well opt for blackmail.

Plus, let's face it. There is no such thing as a "normal" person. The clean living, always-do-the-right-thing, no skeletons person is a Hollywood construct. All of us have inner freakiness that occasionally escapes or squirts out under the pressures of everyday life. We've all done embarrassing, ugly, weird, inappropriate, and or creepy shit that we'd just as soon like to forget. No need for you to agree out loud. I know. No, not all of them, but something, sure as God made little green apples.

I mean, be honest. We are all human and the only thing that separates us from the animals is that we think we are special. Haha.

The thing is, I don't want to know anyone's private life, and I don't give a shit. I have no right to know. Everyone fucks up, and as a culture we have got to stop confusing a human failing with a heinous crime. None of those things that I mentioned are on the same level with lynching, murder of an innocent, rape, or pedophilia. There are obvious and major differences. If you cannot see that, well, by now anyone who can't has long since stopped reading this book anyway. The point is, life has degrees and interesting people, the exact kind that we want to lead and represent us because they are us, have done some idiotic things. For most of us, doing stupid things is how we learn to be smart. Good decisions come from experience, but experience comes from bad decisions.

Therefore, we **MUST** protect those chosen from irrelevant acts of personal or professional destruction by the ruthless and frustrated, especially those fallen from power resentful of what they have lost. We will need a new law making it a criminal offense punishable by long prison terms and forfeiture of assets to spread or leak information derogatory about any person chosen to serve, past or present, **UNLESS** that information has first been

given to and investigated by the FBI or local law enforcement and resulted in indictment. This protection should extend 10 years past the end of a legislator's term to curb acts of malicious retribution by those who cannot just let go out of bitterness or rage of some past action like some spurned ex after a messy divorce.

To be very clear, as a lifelong firm believer in free speech, I can easily understand the OBVIOUS objection to passing a law like this that restricts what some would define as expression. God knows that I think it would be a horrible idea outside of Antipolitism because the professional power seekers would distort and manipulate the law to their benefit in holding onto power.

That said, the right to free speech is already limited under the premise that, metaphorically speaking, you cannot shout "fire" in a crowded theater. By the same reasoning, you should not be allowed to destroy another's life for an irrelevant reason, meaning what happened wasn't illegal, just a human mistake or, even more awful, just a baseless accusation as has become so common as of late. This is particularly true when a person is selflessly serving the public good, a fact guaranteed by Antipolitical selection. In the same way that shooting a cop is a ticket to the most severe of penalties the state mandates, so should the attempt to falsely accuse a public servant be punishable by far more than civil law penalties for slander permits.

Good government requires good people. I don't mean good in the "good versus evil" sense due to the subjectivity of such judgments. We are all sinners in mind, heart, and actions and therefore unless a past action is heinous, we have no right to judge. knowing that he was likely a dead man walking? No. Period. He was a great human being. No more and no less.

We MUST restore civility and humanity to our culture as part of this fresh restart. Yes, things like bastardy must be stigmatized because they are wrecking balls of decency and have horrible effects upon society in general. Yet surely we have the intelligence to know the difference between an absolute wrong and human frailty. Human mistakes should not be weaponized.

At the heart of Antipolitism lies the simple truth that the “Great Man” or the “Irreplaceable Man,” the all-wise, kind, perfect leader that all people seem to seek simply does not and never has existed. King David fucked the Queen of Sheba and sent her husband off to die. Get it? The difference between a “great” leader of the past and what seems to us a pale modern comparison is that today we rip apart all shreds of privacy and decency to expose the simple truth that all leaders are human. Instead of searching for what has never and will never exist and always living in disappointment, magnified today because of the techno-annihilation of privacy and decency, all we have to choose from are the sociopathically damaged and power-obsessed who possess no guilt or shame. We need to get real.

Antipolitism rests on the truth: People are imperfect but, absent the pathological need for power, virtually **anybody** who is educated and has achieved something real in his or her life is vastly superior to what we now have. Sadly, the disaster made by the powerseekers is nearly upon us. It is very unlikely that what must be done will be done, absent great pain. There is a huge difference between wish and hope. I wish we could reset our system absent what is surely coming, but I have very little hope that we will.

As a result, what we must do is spread the word of what CAN be possible and be ready to lead The Reset after the collapse. Share the message of Antipolitism with those who you know who can hear it, and for now don't fret about those that cannot. Change is a difficult thing, as all of us know.

Antipolitism will be ridiculed by the mainstream, but we as its proselytes and preachers must have thick skins and not fall into the traps of bitterness and rage that have already ensnared and poisoned the Right and Left. Let them hurl the muck while we stand ready to selflessly clean up the carnage their myopic pursuit of power will ultimately cause to fall upon us.
